The FAFSA information our Financial Aid office received indicated that you, your spouse or a parent is a “dislocated worker”. The federal definition of a “dislocated worker” lists four types of people who are dislocated workers:

1. A person who is receiving unemployment benefits due to lay off or losing a job and is unlikely to return to a previous occupation.
2. A person who has received a lay-off notice from a job.
3. A self-employed person who has lost income and is under-employed due to the economy.
4. A person who is a displaced homemaker – one who provided unpaid services in the home and is no longer supported by the husband or wife.

Note: A person who has quit a job may not be considered a dislocated work.

Documentation for **each** dislocated worker should be attached to this form and submitted to the Financial Aid office. **(By attaching the required documentation and signing below, you will be requesting a “Professional Judgment”.)**
