



# DENTAL HYGIENE PROGRAM

## Associate in Applied Science in Dental Hygiene

### Program Description

The Dental Hygiene Program is an Associates Degree program that is five semesters in length and is comprised of didactic, clinical, and laboratory courses offered at the Health Science Campus. Students will experience real-life patient interactions through clinical courses and will have the opportunity to work with a variety of patients of diverse backgrounds. Students will also have the opportunity to hone their clinical skills in an on-site, fully-functioning, dental hygiene clinic. Dental hygiene students will be able to study and practice all procedures they will be licensed to perform, including scaling (cleaning) teeth above and below the gumline, polishing structures above the gum-line, performing infiltration anesthetic procedures, teaching oral hygiene instruction, nutritional counseling, and performing all duties of an Expanded-Duty Dental Assistant.

### Is it for you?

The qualified candidate will have excellent manual dexterity, effective communication skills, the ability to maintain a professional demeanor and function well in a clinical setting, and work well in a team environment. Dental hygienists must have extensive knowledge of head and neck anatomy, pharmacology, and clinical procedures.

### Career Description

As a dental hygienist, an individual has the opportunity to work in a variety of settings, including:

- Being employed in a general dental practice under the general supervision of the dentist.
- Being employed in a periodontal practice under the general supervision of a periodontist.
- Being employed to provide services in hospitals, nursing homes, and public health clinics.
- Furthering their education to teach dental hygiene in dental schools or dental hygiene education programs.
- Research of dental-related products.
- Office management and business administration.
- Sales and marketing of dental-related equipment and materials.

## Entry Requirements and Other Program Information

- ▶ Complete the ATDH exam and 15 observation hours before applying
- ▶ High school diploma or GED
- ▶ Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5
- ▶ Complete BIO 210, BIO 211, CHM 105, ENG 101

## In-Program Requirements

- ▶ Medical/Dental examination
- ▶ CPR, background check, and drug screen
- ▶ Hepatitis B Immunization or Titer, MMR Immunization or Titer, Chicken Pox Vaccination or Titer, Two-Step PPD/Chest X-Ray
